An opportunity to hear some delightful woodwind music by talented local performers. **Trio Ébano** makes a welcome return to Parish Music in St Nicholas' Church, Teddington. (admission £10 students free).

The group last played for us in November 2004 shortly after their leader, flautist Nicola Shorland, had become Gloucestershire Young Musician of the Year. She continues to be a dedicated chamber musician and has acquired an interesting collection of flutes, some of which she will demonstrate at the concert. The programme will include duos for flute and clarinet by Rutter and Villa-Lobos, and trios by Scott Joplin, Shostakovich and Mozart.

Nicola is joined in the current ensemble by clarinettist Lucy Tugwell and bassoonist Hannah Wrieden. In 2006 **Trio Ébano** took their music to Singapore where they performed with the Philharmonic Chamber Orchestra, and gave recitals and led workshops in various schools. All the members of the trio value teaching as part of their portfolio. Nicola originally learnt by the Suzuki method with Susie Alington and is now herself an accredited Suzuki Flute teacher.

Parish Music Concerts for the autumn include music for cello and harp in Beckford on Saturday 10 October, played by David Powell and Katherine Thomas. The *Santiago String Quartet* comes to Ashton on Saturday 14 November to play South American as well as European music.

Welcome to our Curate: Sunday 19 July


You are warmly invited to come along and meet Christine Turpin, the new curate, who will be living in Ashton under Hill.

Footpath News - Fly tipping

Those of us who enjoy the countryside are naturally offended by littering and fly tipping, both of which are criminal acts as well as being highly anti-social. Our volunteer group occasionally has to deal with garden waste which has been dumped by local residents and, on two recent occasions, I have had to ask Wychavon District Council to remove much larger quantities of waste, including tyres, which were dumped on the footpath leading off Back Lane.

My experience is that Wychavon responds very quickly and anyone can submit a report by using the *Report It* facility on their web site at: wychavon.whub.org.uk. They will also pursue a prosecution if the offender can be identified. For the most serious cases, the penalties can include unlimited fines and imprisonment. So, if you see an incidence of fly tipping, please report it. The longer it is left, the more likely it is that someone else will think they have found a good place to dump their waste.

Neighbourhood Watch News

Over the last month a series of **hoax telephone calls** have been made to the emergency services from the Ashton public phone box, below the First School. All calls are recorded and are apparently being made by children at various times of the day. The police have asked for any information that may be relevant - please telephone 08457 444 888. Although these calls may not be being made by local children, parents are asked to ensure their children are made aware of the seriousness of making such calls, both for their own sakes and for the sake of those who may need the services which have been sent out in response to a hoax.

Another problem which has also occurred in the last month involves the **theft of money** from plant sales opposite the First School. All proceeds of the sales are donated to the local Air Ambulance, so, although amounts are relatively small, this petty theft is particularly frustrating. Any information or feedback would be very welcome please.

We do need a few more people who are willing to act as **NW volunteers** in the village. Their role is to pass on information to other residents close to where they live; receiving the information direct from West Mercia police. PACT

PACT - Partners And Communities Together

PACT is a scheme designed to enable more effective community engagement. It aims to provide communities with:

- Access – to local authorities through a named point of contact
- Influence – over priorities in their neighbourhood
- Interventions – joint action with partners and communities
- Answers – sustainable solutions and feedback

This is your chance to voice issues and concerns that you feel affect your local community. Everyone in Ashton under Hill will have the opportunity to raise any issue or concern they may have within the village. Once this information is gathered and processed, the top matters raised will then be looked at and taken on by a panel of representatives from local agencies - the **PACT** panel.

Who is on the PACT panel?

- The Local Police & Community Support Officer
- A Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator
- Local Councillors
- Depending on identified priorities, representatives from appropriate agencies

How do I raise an issue or concern?

This can be done through the form distributed with this newsletter, which you can complete and leave at your convenience in one of the drop-in boxes situated in the village. The boxes are situated:

- In the Village Hall (Green Room)
- At Bredon Hill Middle School
- In St Barbara's Church

All **PACT** slips need to be returned to one of these boxes by **MONDAY 1 JUNE 2009** please.
